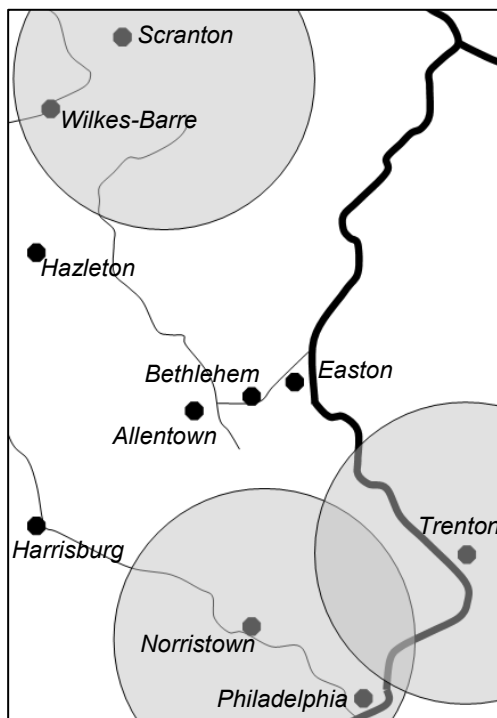


Why Not Catholic Radio in the Lehigh Valley?

Why Catholic Radio?

Have you ever felt overwhelmed in your daily life? Everywhere we turn we find chaos. The Church is our refuge and comfort, but all too often she is either drowned out or contradicted by the media.

Catholic Radio offers an alternative to the secular media, and is consistent with Church teaching. It helps us put our daily lives and today's current events in the proper perspective.

Catholic Radio is...

Available—Everyone can listen, regardless of social status

Personal—Radio touches people personally regardless of where they are. It allows a listener to dialogue with the speaker in the privacy of his own mind.

Continuous—Radio is always available, 24/7, and can be listened to while at home or in the car.

Timely—Radio can cover important issues and concerns as they happen.

Cost-effective—Dollar-for-dollar, radio costs less than any other medium; it reaches more people in less time for less money and with less staff.

What does the Holy Father say about Catholic Radio?

“For the new evangelization to be effective, it is essential to have a deep understanding of the culture of our time in which the social communications media are most influential. Therefore, knowledge and use of the media, whether the more traditional forms or those which technology has produced in recent times, is indispensable. What is “Hearing God’s Call”?

Hearing God’s Call is a lay Catholic apostolate with the purpose of bringing all people to holiness in the Church by preaching and teaching the message of Jesus Christ through the means of radio.

Hearing God’s Call has a secondary purpose of fostering vocations through Catholic Radio. *Hearing God’s Call* believes that by listening to Catholic media on a regular basis, listeners will

- Better discern their vocation (religious or lay), and
- Better fulfill their chosen vocation in their daily lives.

What is Our Status?

Hearing God’s Call is a non-profit Pennsylvania corporation. We are in the early stages of defining and organizing our apostolate. *Hearing God’s Call* does not yet own or operate a radio station, but hopes to do so in the Lehigh Valley. She is a member of the Catholic Radio Association and has already leveraged the Association’s expertise in many areas—legal, technical and operational.

We plan to pursue IRS tax-exempt status as a 501(c)(3) corporation.
